Dale Alan Dunnewold, 54, Nashville, Tennessee, went to be with his Lord and Savior on Saturday,



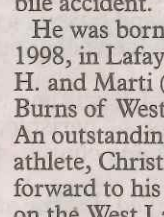
May 28, 2016. He was born April 12, 1962, to Bernie Dunnewold & the late Alyne
